Dr. Susan Renoe is an Assistant Professor of Strategic Communication in the MU School of Journalism. She also serves as the Associate Vice Chancellor for Research Development & Strategic Partnerships at the University of Missouri (MU). Her research uses qualitative methods to explore the cultural spheres researchers inhabit and the strategies they use to navigate them.

Renoe also serves as Executive Director of the Center for Advancing Research Impact in Society, or ARIS, which is funded by the National Science Foundation (OIA Award #1810732). ARIS was established to advance the impacts of research for the betterment of society and the expansion of research. The ARIS community elevates research impact by providing high-quality resources, scholarship, and professional development opportunities and by creating connections among researchers, community partners, and engagement practitioners.

Highly regarded for her experience and expertise related to efforts to advance research excellence and increase the broader, societal impacts of research, Susan serves on several advisory boards, including: NSF's Committee on Equal Opportunities in Science and Engineering (CEOSE), the Network for Advancing & Evaluating the Societal Impact of Science, the Research Impact Assessment Advisory Board for the Centres de Recerca de Catalunya, and the University of Missouri Museum of Anthropology.
